Because of the increased e-mail subscriptions, we have less frequent need for the Bucket Brigade Collections at our meetings. Congratulations!



Oct. 5 & Oct. 7, 2012 - Day on the Bay We will board the Celebration on the Bay motor launch in Jack London Square for a 3 to 4 hour day on the bay. Cost will be \$160/person and include round trip bus from VTA parking lot and a catered lunch while we view the Fleet Week air show (Blue Angels). Although this trip is currently full, an additional cruise on Friday, October 5, is being investigated. This may also open some spaces on Sunday, so if you are interested in either day or have questions, call escorts Jim or Roy.

Golden Gate Fields – October 19, 2012 (1 day) SIR is hosting another race day at Golden Gate Fields. Transportation to the track is not included but price does include admission to the Turf Club, buffet lunch, daily program, valet parking, and the best in thoroughbred horse racing. Cost is \$30. July 10 to 28, 2013 ♦ Baltic Cruise: London to St. Petersburg and back ♦ We transfer to SFO, fly to London and transfer to Southampton to board the Crown Princess for a 14 day cruise of the North and Baltic Seas. We call at Oslo, Norway with its rich Viking history; Gothenburg, Sweden with cobblestone streets and a wonderful coastline and archipelago; Talinn, Estonia, remarkably unchanged since 1154 AD; then a two day call in St Petersburg, Russia, capital of the Tsars and Venice of the North. We continue to Helsinki, Finland, center of Finnish culture and commerce; Stockholm, Sweden, on 14 islands with parks and museums including the 600 room Royal Palace; Copenhagen, Denmark, a fairy tale city with coppery green towers, gingerbread houses and cobblestone streets; and Brussels, Belgium whose diverse architecture ranges from medieval to post modern; returning to Southampton for transfer to our flight home. Come for a trip presentation by the Princess Cruise Sales Manager at Mama Mia's, August 23, 2012 10:30 AM (please reserve). The cost will range from \$3950 for an interior stateroom to \$4795 or \$4890 for a balcony cabin, to \$5445 for a Mini Suite. Prices are per person double occupancy, not including air fare which is not yet available, but use of air line miles is allowed. We are considering a few extra days in London (to be discussed at the August presentation).
