

Fleet Week – October, 2012 (1 day) – Fleet Week date not defined yet. Trip will include bus to Jack London Square to board the Celebration on the Bay motor launch for a day on the bay (catered lunch) to view the Fleet Week air show (Blue Angels). Details and costs are being finalized.

Kauai Golf and Tour – November, 2012 (12 days) – We will be staying in luxury condos on Kalapaki Beach (Kauai) and playing golf every other day. On alternate days we will tour the island to see Kauai's unique attractions such as Waimea Canyon, the Na Pali Coast, Spouting Horn, and Hanalei. Price includes air fare, accommodations, Kauai transportation, scenic tours, all breakfasts, several meals, and golf at 5 different quality courses. This is a group trip that has not been done before and is being considered because Jim just returned from Kauai and thought others might also enjoy the experience. We expect the costs to be approximately \$5000 pp. This will be our first attempt at a golf trip and it will be limited to 12 people. Contact Jim ASAP if you are interested.

Golden Gate Fields — April 20, 2012 (1 day) SIR is hosting another race day at Golden Gate Fields. Transportation to the treek is not included but price does include admission

Gate Fields. Transportation to the track is not included but price does include admission to the Turf Club, buffet lunch, daily program, valet parking, and the best in thoroughbred horse racing. Cost is \$30/person. Deadline is April 1, 2012. Tickets will be delivered at Branch Meeting on April 19, 2012. Contact Jim or Roy to attend.

Giants Spring Training – March 22-26, 2012 (5 Days) – Fly San Jose to Phoenix for 3 Giants Spring Training games. We will be staying at the Holiday Inn Express in Old Town Scottsdale, a few blocks from the Scottsdale Stadium. Trip includes home pick up/return, air fare, airport transfers, accommodations, all breakfasts, 1 dinner, admission to 3 games, and free time between games. Cost is \$1295 (dbl) and \$1745 (sgl). Call Jim if you have questions.

<u>Seattle/San Juan Islands – May 19-24, 2012 (6 Days)</u> — We meet at San Jose Airport and fly to Seattle for 3 nights with tours of the Boeing Aircraft factory, Underground Seattle, Pioneer Square, and the opportunity to visit Pike Place Market and Seattle Center and Space Needle. We finish at the Crab Pot Restaurant for a Pacific Clambake Dinner. Then it's on to Friday Harbor for 3 days (2 nights) of scenic cruising, sightseeing, and whale watching. We close with a farewell dinner in Friday Harbor. Cost of \$2195 pp includes air fare, airport transfers, accommodations, and a free day in Seattle, all breakfasts, 2 dinners, and the opportunity to see the whales up close. Call Jim or Roy if you have questions.

Paris, Rhone River, and Provence – September 1 to 14, 2012 (14 days) – After our SFO to Marseille (France) flight, we take a motor coach to Arles where we board the UniWorld 5 star rated cruise ship, the "River Royale". The next 8 days (7 nights) we cruise the Rhone and Saone Rivers, with stops and day tours in Avignon, Viviers, Tournon, Lyon, and Chalon sur Saone. After disembarkation at Chalon sur Saone, we board the TGV (Bullet Train) to Paris. We have 5 nights in Paris at a luxury hotel near the Eiffel Tower. Our first 2 post cruise days will include a full day guided tour of Versailles followed by a full day guided tour of Paris (highlighted by the Louvre, the Cathedral of Notre Dame, the Arc de Triomphe, the Opera, the Madeleine, the Champ Elsysees, and the Eiffel Tower). Our last 2 full days in Paris are open, but with a bus and guide at our disposal. We (inputs encouraged) will decide which attractions we will visit (or revisit) those last 2 days. The cost is \$7248 to \$7517 pp, depending on the cabin category, including air fare, transfers, accommodations, taxes, cruise meals, land breakfasts, the Versailles Tour, and the Paris City Tour. The Paris extension can be deleted for a saving of \$1100. For questions or a brochure, call Jim or Roy.

Well, here we are Branch 62 Sirs, another year ahead of us. Congratulations to Armond King for his diligent and well done job as last year's Big Sir. Our Area Governor, Gene Elliott, and his wife Janet attended the Dinner. Gene swore in the new Executive Board and Officers for 2012.

It was a priority with the SIR State Officers last year that we do what we can to increase the membership in all Branches. The state goal was to recruit 1,900 new members for the year 2011. Branch leaders exceeded this goal by recruiting and inducting 2,100 new members. While this was a significant win for the state, we are still in need of new members. Membership declined from 32,000 members in 1990 to about 18,000 today. 44 branches failed and closed in the last 12 years. According to our State President, this happened because we lost focus on maintaining a balance of newer and older members in our branches. We all need to do what we can to go out and talk to your neighbors, friends and relatives to join our fun type organization.
