# **SIR TRAVEL - BRANCH 62**

**Reminder:** Trips organized by Sons in Retirement (SIR) are available not only to SIR members and their spouses but also to guests of SIR members and widows of SIR members.

November 4-17, 2014 Spain The trip has planned 13 days to experience historic and culturally diverse Spain. We stop at only three locations, so the amount of packing, moving, and unpacking is limited. We arrive in Madrid (4 nights) with a city tour and optional day trips to Segovia and Toledo. On the way to Valencia (4 nights) we stop at Cuenca. In Valencia we have a city tour and a visit to the Lladro museum, and an optional day trip to Manises and Lake Albufera. Next, it's on to Barcelona with a stop in Tarragona. In Barcelona (4 nights) we have a panoramic tour and an optional day trip to the Codornia Winery and Montserrant. The cost is \$4195 dbl and \$4395 single. The cost includes all air fare, accommodations, tours, taxes, gratuities, all breakfasts, ten other meals, and transfers between cities. There is also available a pretrip to Basque Country (Bilbao and San Sebastian) and a post-trip to Malaga. Each added trip is for 4 nights and costs \$795. Brochures will be available from Jim or Roy, or from the branch travel table. If you have questions please call Jim or Roy.
