BRANCH 62 EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING EXCERPTS of the MINUTES from March 21, 2013

Secretary Art Bedford: A motion to approve the minutes of the February Executive Committee meeting, which were e-mailed to committee members in advance, was passed.

Treasurer Roger Falberg Detailed information on the cash position at the end of February was not available at the meeting. We are now being held to a minimum attendance of 75 by the Elks Club management. For each paid attendee short of 75 we now pay the Elks Club \$16. We will attempt to negotiate a lower minimum. Roger recommended a bucket brigade collection today of \$1 per person. A motion to approve the Treasurer's Report was passed. (A post meeting report indicates a checking account balance at the end of February of \$1,234.80 and \$150 in the savings account for a total of \$1,384.80).

Membership Chairman Russ Kohlrust reported no change in the membership status since February: Active 109, Inactive10, and one candidate in process, Mike Klein who will be inducted at the April meeting. Mike is out sick today. Russ is working on Gene Elliot's request for a Branch Organization board showing our organization with Sirs' pictures in order to facilitate communication and discussion among luncheon attendees. Our Branch goals are 70% of active membership, 77 members attending each luncheon, and 13 new members this year. So far we are falling short of these goals. Russ will have brochures and application forms at the luncheon today. (Post meeting note: attendance at today's luncheon is 73 or 67% of current membership). A review of attendance records by Russ and Dick Tillinger shows 7 members who have not attended one luncheon in the last 18 months. Russ will contact each one to ask if we can do anything to help them attend, such as driving them to the meetings or calling to remind them of the meetings. Transportation Chairman George Giorgi has resigned from the branch and the Nominating Committee will need to look for a replacement. Recruitment Chairman Ron Olson presented a thermometer type chart showing progress toward our recruitment goals. The chart will be updated monthly and displayed at all luncheon meetings as part of our program to encourage members to bring potential new members as guests. Ron distributed a list of ideas for new activities. Many were from Branch One and he added others including horseshoes, model airplanes/railroads, barbershop chorus, lawn bowling, pinochle, woodworking, bicycle club, dinner theater group, chess and writing life stories. Other suggestions were advertising at markets and Operation Giving, used at some branches to collect food items for distribution to local food banks. We might also consider adding other activities designed to contribute to the community outside of SIR.

November 13-25, 2013 Paris, Rhone River, Burgundy, and Provence We are proposing a less expensive version of the Rhone River cruise previously listed. We fly from San Francisco to Nice for an overnight stay and short exploration. The next day a motor coach takes us to Arles, with a stop at the Rhone American (WWII) Cemetery. At Arles, we board the Grand Circle 5-star rated cruise ship "Provence," and after touring Arles we depart for an 8-day (7-night) cruise of the Rhone and Saone Rivers, with stops, day tours, and free time in Avignon, Viviers, Tournon, Lyon, and Macon, also an overnight stop in Trevoux. After disembarking in Macon, we board a bus for Paris, with a stop and walking tour in Beaune en route. We have three nights in Paris at the Moderate First Class Novotel Paris Eiffel Tower (or similar) hotel. Our stay in Paris includes a panoramic tour, passing by the Champs Elysees, Eiffel Tower, Cathedral of Notre Dame and other landmarks, and a guided tour of Versailles. Another day will feature an optional tour of the Louvre and a half day free. The cost is \$4510 or \$4710 (lower deck), or \$5210 (upper deck) pp/dbl occupancy, or \$5355 single, including air fare, transfers, accommodations, taxes, cruise meals, breakfasts, and Paris and Versailles tours. For those wanting to explore further, there are extensions available in Nice (3 nights) for about \$645 and Paris (3 nights) for about \$695. Brochures are available from Jim or Roy, or from your branch travel table. A trip presentation is scheduled for May 9, 2013, 2 PM, at Mama Mia's, 300 E Hamilton Ave, Campbell, CA.


