# Cancelled - September 7, 2013 America's Cup Finals

This trip is regretfully cancelled. The trip became more complex and did not seem to offer a satisfactory experience with costs and cost structure we could handle. If you have questions, call Jim or Roy

**Cancelled** - **October 13, 2013 Fleet Week** The rest of the Blue Angels 2013 season has been cancelled. Therefore, this trip is cancelled. If you have any questions, call Jim or Roy.

**Sep. or Oct. 2013 – Edna Valley wine trip & Hearst Castle** (2 to 3 days) We are still investigating this trip, watch for details.

November 13-25, 2013 Paris, Rhone River, Burgundy, and Provence This is a less expensive version of the Rhone River cruise previously listed. We fly from San Francisco to Nice for an overnight stay and short exploration. The next day a motor coach takes us to Arles, with a stop at the Rhone American (WWII) Cemetery. At Arles, we board the Grand Circle 5-star rated cruise ship "Provence," and after touring Arles we depart for an 8-day (7-night) cruise of the Rhone and Saone Rivers, with stops in Avignon, Viviers, Tournon, Lyon, and Macon and Trevoux. After disembarking in Macon, we board a bus for Paris, with a stop in Beaune en route. We have three nights in Paris at the Moderate First Class Novotel Paris Eiffel Tower (or similar) hotel. Our stay in Paris includes a panoramic tour, passing by the Champs Elysees, Eiffel Tower, Cathedral of Notre Dame and other landmarks, a quided tour of Versailles, an optional tour of the Louvre and a half day free. The cost is \$4510 or \$4710 (lower deck), or \$5210 (upper deck) pp/dbl occupancy, or \$5355 single, including air fare, transfers, accommodations, taxes, cruise meals, breakfasts, and Paris and Versailles tours. There are extensions available in Nice (3 nights) for about \$645 and Paris (3 nights) for about \$695. Brochures are available from Jim or Roy, or from the branch travel table.

**November, 2014 Spain (11 to 14 days)** We are now considering a couple of options for a visit to historic and culturally diverse Spain. The tours may be 11 to 14 days, and will feature 3 to 5 nights in Madrid and 2 to 4 nights in Barcelona. Depending on the actual choice of trip, we may spend 4 nights in Valencia or 2 nights in Seville and a night in Granada. The actual choice of trip, detailed itinerary, and the costs will be available shortly, but the cost should be under \$4100 pp/dbl. occ., including airport transfers, airfare, hotel accommodations, and several meals. There may be a 4 night pre-trip option to the Basque region and a 4 night post-trip option to Malaga, Spain. Please call Jim or Roy if you are interested or have a question
