
To all Members:

October 2013 Hearst Castle and the Edna Valley. We will be taking the train (AMTRAK) to San Luis Obispo and spending 3 nights at the Embassy Suites. One of the days will be touring Hearst Castle (2 tours included) and a stop at a local winery on the way back to the hotel. Another day will be touring and tasting in the wine country of the Edna Valley. The cost is \$895, which includes train fare, bus, taxes, accommodations, all breakfasts, 2 lunches, 1 dinner, ground transportation between events, and all tours. Brochures are available from Jim or Roy, or from the branch travel table.

November 13-25, 2013 Paris, Rhone River, Burgundy, and Provence. This is a less expensive version of the Rhone River cruise previously listed. We fly from San Francisco to Nice for an overnight stay and short exploration. The next day a motor coach takes us to Arles, with a stop at the Rhone American (WWII) Cemetery. At Arles, we board the Grand Circle 5-star rated cruise ship "Provence," and after touring Arles we depart for an 8-day (7-night) cruise of the Rhone and Saone Rivers, with stops in Avignon, Viviers, Tournon, Lyon, and Macon and Trevoux. After disembarking in Macon, we board a bus for Paris, with a stop in Beaune en route. We have three nights in Paris at the Moderate First Class Novotel Paris Eiffel Tower (or similar) hotel. Our stay in Paris includes a panoramic tour, passing by the Champs Elysees, Eiffel Tower, Cathedral of Notre Dame and other landmarks, a guided tour of Versailles, an optional tour of the Louvre and a half day free. The cost is \$4510 or \$4710 (lower deck), or \$5210 (upper deck) pp/dbl occupancy, or \$5355 single, which includes air fare, transfers, accommodations, taxes, cruise meals, breakfasts, and Paris and Versailles tours. There are extensions available in Nice (3 nights) for about \$645 and Paris (3 nights) for about \$695. Brochures are available from Jim or Roy, or from the branch travel table. Continued on page 6.

November 3-17, 2014 Spain The trip has planned 13 days in Spain to experience the historic and culturally diverse Spain. We arrive in Madrid (5 nights) with a city tour and day trips to Segovia and Toledo. On the way to Valencia (4 nights) we stop at Cuenca. From Valencia we have scheduled day trips to Manises, and Lake Albufera. Next, it's on to Barcelona with a city tour and day trips to the Llado Museum, Montserrant, and Codornia Winery. The cost is \$4195 dbl and \$4395 single. The cost includes all air fare, accommodations, tours, taxes, gratuities, all breakfasts, some other meals, and transfers between cities. There is also a pre-trip to Basque Country (Bilbao and San Sebastian) and a post-trip to Malaga. Each added trip is for 4 nights and costs \$795. Brochures will be available from Jim or Roy, or from the branch travel table.
