

1. If at all possible, please buy your lunch ticket at the meeting preceding the one you plan to attend.

If you cannot buy your meal for the next month at the luncheon or send your money to the Little Sir at least one week in advance (that's the Thursday before the meeting), then don't come to the meeting expecting to eat. If there is an emergency and you can't make the meeting, call the Little Sir and he will decide if it is a true emergency and will forward the ticket to the following month. This is going to be enforced and if you buy a ticket and don't show up without letting the Little Sir know you will lose your money.

3. 
June, 2015 (6 days) - Las Vegas, World Series of Poker (WSOP): Exact date TBA when 2015 WSOP schedule is defined. Watch or play (entry fee not included) in the Senior WSOP at the Rio Hotel and Casino, or pursue other Vegas activities. Cost is \$675 (dbl) and \$850 (sgl), includes airport transfers (home to SJC & LAS to the Rio), air fare & 5 nights in a luxury suite at the Rio.

November 5–23, 2015 - Crossroads of Turkey - Land tour of Turkey begins with 3 days in Istanbul, proceeds to Asiatic Turkey featuring stops at Gallipoli battlefields, legendary Troy, many ancient Biblical, Roman and Greek sites, fascinating geological features & history back to the Hittites, ending in Ankara. Per Person cost is \$3795, includes air fare from SFO, tour transportation, all hotel accommodations, all taxes and fees, gratuities for drivers/guides, 35 meals. Optional 5 day pre-trip to Athens is available for \$1295.

January 9 – 19, 2016: Mexican Riviera: Grand Princess cruise from San Francisco (no air) with stops in Puerto Vallarta, Manzanillo, Mazatlan, and Cabo San Lucas. Per person double occupancy cost ranges from \$1455 (Interior), to \$1995 (Balcony), includes home pick up to & from SF Pier, cruise meals & entertainment, all taxes and fees, gratuities for drivers & porters.

Narrative

Each year we have fewer members to support the same or greater fixed costs. The burden falls on those members attending the luncheons, since they are the ones paying the extra \$2, and they are the ones most likely to pay the annual dues. Some members still feel that dues are voluntary and for whatever reason don't pay. Annual fixed costs less the support from the picnic, dinner dance, and raffle run about \$1,900. That's about \$30 per active member. If we priced luncheons at cost, each active member would need to pay annual dues of \$30. Each member should understand this.
