Primary causes of the2014 deficit are (1) that luncheon was priced at cost for the first six months costing about \$420, and (2) that picnic revenues were about \$300 below prior years.

Our objective in prior years was to maintain this at \$1,500.

<u>Narrative</u>

Each year we have fewer members to support the same or greater fixed costs. The burden falls on those members attending the luncheons, since they are the ones paying the extra \$2, and they are the ones most likely to pay the annual dues. Some members still feel that dues are voluntary and for whatever reason don't pay. Annual fixed costs less the support from the picnic, dinner dance, and raffle run about \$1,900. That's about \$30 per active member. If we priced luncheons at cost, each active member would need to pay annual dues of \$30. Each member should understand this.
