December was a good month for Monday 18 hole golf. Rain was not in the cards and the grass started to green up for us.

The 14^{th} , at San Jose, netted a first out of 12 players for Bob Byers with a net 70. Dan Freitas did it again on the 21^{st} at Spring Valley, besting 12 players with a net 61. Dan tied Jim Marquez to beat 12 golfers at Los Lagos on the 28^{th} with net 70 and had to share first place. The handicap system has noted Dan's improvement and lowered his Golfer Index by 1.4 points.

The golfer's index is an indication of his <u>potential</u>. It is based on a comparison of his scores versus the course rating and adjusted for the slope of the course and tees being played. The rating is what the average professional would score. The slope is an adjustment for the degree of difficulty. More on index next month.
