I noticed some players taking a drop incorrectly after hitting a the ball in a water hazard (or any hazard marked by red stakes). There are two options. Both require the player to find the point at which the ball's flight last crossed the hazard boundary (not where the ball splashed in the water). Even if the ball crossed the water and then rolled back into it – the point of entry is where the ball rolled in. In the first option, the player may take two club lengths relief from the point of entry, no nearer the hole. For the second option, the player may drop as far away from the hole as he wishes along a line between the point of entry and the pin.

Oct. 9, 2016 Fleet Week Air Show Cruise (1 day): Watch the 2016 Air Show from San Francisco Bay on a buffet lunch cruise aboard the iconic San Francisco Belle.
