I notice that some players have a unique interpretation of where the tee box is relative to the markers. Some seem to think that the markers are in the middle of the tee box and so they can tee the ball in front of the markers. This is not the case. If you tee the ball in front of the center of the markers, your shot doesn't count and you must hit another ball properly teed using your third stroke. (A penalty called stroke and distance). I strongly suggest you tee the ball at least a foot BEHIND the markers.
