June 3 – 18, 2019 Great Rivers of Europe: Join us for a cruise from Vienna, along the Danube, Rhine-Main-Danube Canal and the Main and Rhine Rivers, ending in Amsterdam. Cost is \$5875 to \$7275 pp/dbl. occ., depending on cabin choice (single supplement is \$745) including air fare. Discounts available for full early payment. A pretrip extension in Vienna for \$795 and a post trip extension to Bruges, Belgium for \$795 are available.

Nov. 4th – 23rd, 2019 Inside Vietnam: We'll travel the country from north to south, visiting places like Hanoi, Hue, Danang, Ho Chi Minh City (Saigon), the Cu Chi Tunnels, Mekong Delta and more. Cost is \$3775 per person, single or double, including air fare. Discounts available for full early payment. A 3 night in-route stopover in Hong Kong (\$695), a pre-trip visit to Northern Hill Tribes (\$1095) and a post trip extension to the famous temples at Angkor Wat, Cambodia (\$1395) are available.
