Our speaker for April is novelist **Gisela Zebroski**. She will be speaking on "*The Berlin Airlift, the Candy Bomber, and I*".

In 1948, Stalin blocked all land access routes to the city of Berlin. That left 2 million Berliners and 8,000 occupation forces without sustenance.

Harry Truman ordered: "We shall stay! Period." On June 25, 1948 an airlift was established: Operation Vittles. Over the following 11 months American and British war planes became transport aircraft that flew three hundred thousand missions and delivered 2.3 million tons of supplies.

This operation deterred Stalin's invasion of Berlin and Western Europe.
