Nov. $4^{th} - 23^{rd}$, 2019 Inside Vietnam: We'll travel the country from north to south, visiting places like Hanoi, Hue, Danang, Ho Chi Minh City (Saigon), the Cu Chi Tunnels, Mekong Delta and more. Cost is \$3775 per person, single or double, including air fare. A 3 night en route stopover in Hong Kong (\$695), a pre-trip visit to Northern Hill Tribes (\$1095) and a post trip extension to Cambodia and the famous temples at Angkor Wat (\$1395) are available.
