September Speaker

Program Title: Picking Tomatoes When the Sky Was in Flame

Our speaker, author Ursula Smith, was a young child in Germany when World War II broke out. Her home located in the German town of Essen was a major target of Allied bombings. She remembers vividly holding a basket of tomatoes in her front garden while B17s were dropping bombs aimed at the coal mine across the street...where her father, a coal miner worked. "Picking Tomatoes When the Sky Was in Flame" is the title of a book she wrote about her experiences. Her story describes what life was like during the bombings in Essen. Ninety percent of the infrastructure was destroyed; sixty percent of its residents were left homeless. Her family survived but it was a physical and emotional struggle. She gave her talk to SIR Branch 20 last February. Program Chair Jim Healey described it as "EXCELLENT...she was polished and articulate...got quite emotional when describing the bombings in her town."

If you want to join us, let Roger know ahead of time so he can arrange the player tables. If you want to learn how to register or use BBO, contact Roger or me.


