Abstract of Minutes of Branch Executive Committee (BEC) 5-20-21

Big Sir: Wally Anderson: Opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance. Wally welcomed everyone to our Zoom BEC meeting. Wally opened the discussion about the possibility of sharing a Luncheon meeting with Branch 54 at the 3 Flames Restaurant in San Jose on the second Thursday of the Month instead of our normal third Thursday. The reason being that the 3 Flames requires that we have a minimum of 50 people at the luncheon. Neither Branch could meet the requirement alone. After much discussion, it was decided that Wally would present this to our members at our Zoom luncheon and then poll the members to see who would agree to attend the luncheon at 3 Flames. Wally called for an Emergency meeting after the Luncheon to go over the results of the poll and then make a decision whether to proceed or not with the Luncheon with Branch 54. Wally proposed a motion to approve an Emergency Meeting. Upon a motion by Steve Burnham and seconded by John Dieckman, the motion was approved. Wally also wants to discuss our July Picnic at the meeting.

<u>Travel: Jim Hohenshelt</u>: Jim asked the Board to approve a SIR trip to the Adriatic and Croatia in April 2022. On a motion by Paul Goodwin and seconded by Roger Falberg, the motion was approved for Jim and Roy to go ahead with negotiating pricing and plans for the trip.
