#### May 20 Meeting Speakers: Patricia Strach and Kathleen Sullivan <u>Topic</u>: Dirty Politics: How Corruption Was Used to Clean San Francisco

On garbage day, San Francisco residents take their trash and recycling out to the curb. Recology, formerly Sunset Scavenger Company, picks up the trash as it has since the midnineteenth century. Remarkably, garbage collection hasn't changed much in that time. It's easy to forget that routine, effective trash collection and disposal service was not always the norm. In fact, 19<sup>th</sup> century cities struggled with mounting trash.

The presenters discuss the origins of trash collection and its political struggles.
