Abstract of Minutes of the October 13th Branch Executive Committee (BEC)

Big Sir: Steve Burnham: Opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance. Steve welcomed everyone to our BEC meeting. Steve started the meeting by revisiting the policy for readmittance of members who dropped for non-payment of annual dues. After discussing the issue, it was agreed upon to just let them return once they pay their dues. Steve asked Wally Anderson and John Dieckman to give a report on their efforts to find a new location for our Luncheon. They said they had met with the Asst. Manager at Macara restaurant at the Sunnyvale Golf Course. After some preliminary discussion about pricing and menu, it was decided that they would go back for more talks with the Manager. Wally and John said they would continue to look for other venues. Steve gave us information on the three new SIR Awards Policy: Honorary Life Member, Distinguished Service Award, and I'm Doing My Part Award. Steve said these awards are Gold, Silver, and Rooster lapel pins. He also told us where to go to find out the requirements of the awards and how to nominate someone for the I'm Doing My Part Award.

<u>Area Governor Report Phil Thomas</u>: Phil said that at the latest State Board Meeting it was decided to eliminate all Regional Directors next year. They will be reassigning Area Governors.
