Columbia-Snake River Cruise

Some members requested we investigate a river cruise on the Columbia and Snake Rivers, likely in June, July, or August of 2024. This would start in Clarkston, Washington on the border with Idaho, proceed down the Snake River to the Columbia and on through the Columbia River Gorge to Astoria on the coast, then turn around and end in Portland, Oregon. Alternatively, the trip could be in the opposite direction. Along with some wonderful scenery along the rivers there will be side trips to Mt. Hood, Mt. St. Helens, Multnomah Falls, and Pendleton, Oregon. The trip is 11 days, the first night in a hotel and the rest of them on the river boat.
